I wanted this program to be an extension of our school that has that "small school" community feeling. I want to take the opportunity to introduce Janet Bryant, as "The Cove" Coordinator. Many of you know Janet as a former YMCA coordinator. She brings a wealth of experience and skills to our new program. "Mrs. Janet" has taught in private schools and has 20 years of experience organizing high quality childcare. In addition, she is bi-lingual. She speaks and has taught Spanish in the past.

We have already begun adding enrichment classes that are available to ALL students - regardless if they are in The Cove program or not. Some of these programs are from North Florida Martial Arts, Building Minds (Legos), L.E.E. (Spanish) and Art on the Go. In addition, we are starting after-school tutoring. "The Cove" afterschool program also offers childcare in the morning, starting at 7am, and after-school till 6pm. Episcopal Childcare Services is accepted.
