It is hard to believe that we are already in November. The school year is flying by so fast. There is a lot to do, to teach and to learn. For this reason, we are addressing many of our absences, tardiness, and frequent check-outs. Several students seem to be falling into the "frequent flyers" category. Both Mrs. Keaton and I will be making phone calls to provide "gentle reminders" before having to proceed to our RTI (Response to Intervention) team with a member of the district's Student Services Department involved. Parents, please make every effort to ensure your child is at school every day and on time. A reminder that we do not permit early check-out after 2:15pm. This is a crucial time, as teachers are wrapping up lessons with important information to go home.

Two important safety issues have been brought to my attention during after-school dismissal. Please do not walk from your car to take your child from the car rider area/patio. We are dismissing over 460 students each day and cannot have staff members take their attention off of the students. Also, we will not permit your child to walk around the car to enter. All students should enter on the passenger side of the car – no exceptions. Cars that are ready to exit often pull around other cars and would not be able to see a child coming around.
