News from Principal Tucker

Dear Ketterlinus Families and Friends -

It has been a great first three weeks of school. The kids, families, and staff are truly amazing here at KES! I say this often ,but it was affirming when our new school nurse, Tabitha Slaughter, walked up to me and said, "The kids here are very special!" It led to a long discussion of how wonderful our school and students are here at Ketterlinus. We share common values and expectations with our students, parents and staff, and are part of a community that is dedicated to supporting KES.

As we are moving forward with the academics and school routines, I want to share with you an important topic in light of recent news. KES is committed to the security and safety of our students and staff. We work very closely with the St. Augustine Police Department. We are fortunate that they station themselves in front of our school almost every morning and afternoon. In addition, we had the St. Johns County Sheriff's Office conduct a security audit.

Everyone that enters our school should have made prior arrangements or have a scheduled appointment with their child's teacher or staff member. We want to keep our hallways as clear as possible in order to keep an orderly and safe environment. Our mornings are extremely busy with having 440+ students entering our school in a short span of time. In addition, we want to account for every adult entering the building and their purpose know his/her for being in the school and being near your child. If you have an appointment or have made arrangements to be at the school, please sign in on the computer as a VOLUNTEER and the front office receptionist will call the staff member, announce that you have arrived, and direct you to the classroom/office. You will need to wear the yellow badge. This tells staff members and students that you are cleared to be in the school. Please know that my intentions are never to create procedures and policies that offend or inconvenience others, but to create the safest and most secure environment for our students, staff and volunteers.

We had planned a routine fire drill on Thursday, however, due to the circumstances of other schools being on lockdown, we decided to postpone the drill. We will do a practice fire drill AND LOCKDOWN drill next week. I will send an email reminding parents of this PRACTICE DRILL as not to cause an alarm. In the event there is a real emergency, parents will be notified via an automated phone call and/or text. Next week, we will be sending out information on opting out of this text option if you prefer NOT to get an automated text for all school alerts. I strongly encourage you to make sure you have updated cell phone or emergency numbers on file. This can be done by accessing Home Access Center (HAC). We have noticed that only a small percentage of parents have signed up to access Home Access Center. Please consider accessing Home Access Center to stay informed of your child's academic progress.
