Principal's Corner

Dear Ketterlinus Family and Friends,

I hope you all enjoyed the winter holiday break. Over the next few months, you will notice some upgrades to our school security – specifically access to the school. In December, both our School Advisory Council (SAC) and our Parent Teacher Organization (PTO) met to discuss this topic. Both meetings were open to all Ketterlinus stakeholders. Ketterlinus will be installing an electronic door system during the school day. This is also known as the "buzz in/out" system. Please note this will create an inconvenience for some, but will add to our school security upgrades. You may be required to wait at the front door before entering. You must bring an government issued license or ID to enter the building and have an approved school access form to go beyond the front office.

Recently, I stood firm on not allowing visitors without an approved (background check by SJSO) to enter the school for a kindergarten play. Several parents, visitors and grandparents were turned away. It has never been my intention to upset or prevent a guardian to part of their child's school experience. However, several parents/guardians never filled out a school access form despite our numerous notifications. This has been a very intentional initiative by our school to notify parents of this procedure and school policy for the last two school years. At times, the approval process can take up to 4-6 weeks when there are similar names that might cause a delay. Please allow enough time for the approval process. When the application is denied, a letter is generated by our school district office and mailed to the applicant. It is up to the applicant to follow the district process to have it

As recent events have influenced our attitudes, policies and procedures, I ask that you have patience and support us with fully implementing our school access procedures.

Important & Helpful Information regarding School Access:

*An APPROVED school access form is required for EVERYONE and ANYTHING beyond the front office during the school day. This includes: lunch with your child, performances, classroom presentations, spelling bee, volunteering, book fair...

*Complete a school access on-line from the link our school website: www-kes. stjohns.k12.fl.us

*Call the school to see if it has been approved. We are hoping that this process can be streamlined in the future, but the current system does not allow this.

*Allow at least 4 weeks for the approval process to take place. Plan ahead! If there is a field trip or a luncheon the next day, it will not be approved in time.

*Surprise visit from a relative? Plan an activity after school hours for quality time. Please don't put us in a position in turning away Grandma, Grandpa or the favorite Aunt. However, we have to ensure everyone that comes in contact with your child has been through a background check.

*Bring your government issued ID to the front office at all times.

*Please support this initiative despite any inconvenience. Display good character despite a delay in time or extra request to produce ID. We are here for the children.

Independent Reading is one strand of literacy education in your child's balanced literacy program. Independent reading is kind of a misnomer because the term leads us to believe the reader does it alone. While our ultimate goal is to produce successful, independent readers who love to read, creating that independence in our readers is a process, an end result. Daily support and encouragement to support them and move toward a gradual release of responsibility to the student is the best approach to independence. Teachers and parents should always know what their students are reading and stay involved by discussing, encouraging, celebrating to keep the reader interested and growing.

Think back to teaching your child how to ride a bike without training wheels. You held on, ran beside him or her until the child was ready to ride independently. That gradual release model helped your child succeed. The same is true with independent reading!

A Little Guidance

Welcome 2016! The first half of the year I had the pleasure of meeting with each classroom a minimum of three lessons. The focus of these lessons centered on academic, career, and personal/social development. During the next quarter, we will be preparing for our state assessment, Florida Standards Assessment (FSA). Students in grade 3, 4, and 5 will be taking the FSA. Fourth and Fifth, grade writing will be held the first week of March. Along with testing, sometimes comes "test anxiety": that nervous, unsure and sometimes distressed feeling before taking a test. Having a plan and being prepared can help alleviate some of those unsure feelings. Organize your homework and find a quiet place to study. Organize your time, review, have a homework/ study buddy and remember that everyone learns in different ways. My goal is to meet with each classroom (grades 3 -5) to discuss successful test taking strategies. In grade K -2 my focus will be on academic development and success. The students at Ketterlinus are truly wonderful to work with, bringing such enthusiasm and desire to learn.
