October was a busy month here at Ketterlinus! Cooler temps, Halloween, and UNITY Day! UNITY Day was celebrated school-wide to unite against bullying and celebrate kindness, acceptance and inclusion. I have to say I saw a lot of orange that day. In addition, each grade level was given a 20 and /or 40-minute presentation on Bullying Prevention. Students were taught the three foundational principles that constitute bullying: Repeated, imbalance of power and makes it hard to learn. Often times students have conflict with peers. Conflict has an equal balance of power between both parties. It could be a disagreement or a situation where both parties are contributing to the misunderstanding. Teaching students to handle conflict peacefully is a huge lesson to learn. During guidance lessons, students are learning that it takes practice to be a peacemaker. It is through communication, teamwork and respect that we are all peacemakers.

Home Access Center (HAC) 2018 – 2019

Ketterlinus Elementary grades (K-5) will utilize several components of the Home Access Center (HAC) this year. We ask that all parents utilize HAC. The Home Access Center (HAC) allows students and parents to view their child’s educational information via a secure, password protected website. See the features and benefits of HAC below:

Features:

- Calendar provides a customizable quick view of courses, events, activities, and assignments
- Provides parents and students with a daily summary page of student information
- Schedule and attendance, discipline information, class work, test scores and course requests
- Allows students to view their own records to help keep them informed about their progress.

Benefits:

- Provides parents with relevant and timely information to support and direct their children
- Helps open a consistent avenue of parent/teacher communication
- Creates stronger connections between students, parents, teachers, and administrators
- Empowers students to actively participate in their progress and future
- Electronic source to access interims and report cards

Extended Absences

Please remember that all extended absences must be approved prior to the absence. All requests must be submitted in writing to the front office.

Check-Outs

Check-outs will not be permitted after 2:15 Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, or Friday (1:15 on Wednesday). This allows the front office to give their attention to dismissing the over 400 students who are ready to go home for the day. Thank you for understanding that unless it is an emergency, you will be asked to wait until dismissal is complete.

If you know that you will be picking your child up early from school, please send a note to the teacher so that they can be prepared for your child to leave early.

Is your Child Prepared?

Please remember to send your child in tennis shoes EVERY school day. Students must wear tennis shoes to P.E. and also to recess. Hair needs to be pulled away from the face (girls and boys). Students can bring water bottles to school but they must be filled with water only. No juice or sports drinks. Please send in a note if your child is injured or ill and needs to be excused from P.E. class.

Cafeteria News

In an effort to reduce Styrofoam waste in landfills, SJCS and Ketterlinus Elementary will discontinue the use of black and white Styrofoam trays during the next few weeks.

Some important facts (please share with students)

- Styrofoam (EPS; expanded polystyrene) is not recycled.
- The half-life of Styrofoam is 500 years.
- 30% of our waste in landfills is Styrofoam.
- We are trying to reduce our waste in landfills
- The new trays are made from 100% recycled material and are 100% compostable
- The new trays are shrink wrapped to reduce packaging waste
- The trays were tested within the district and have had great success.

The Importance of RSVPs

Thank you to all of those parents who RSVP’d for the Costume Parade. RSVPs are important so that we can ensure that all adults entering the school property have the appropriate APPROVED School Access. It is never our intention to inconvenience you but to always provide the safest environment for our students. The need for advanced RSVPs are necessary for ALL events that invite adults on to the school property. This includes Costume Parade, Grandparent Breakfast, Donuts with Dad, Muffins with Mom, Character Counts ceremonies, etc. To be consistent and to be fair, we will no longer be able to accept late RSVPs for these events. Please know that we never want to turn parents/guardians/grandparents away but we need to allow staff time to confirm school access for all adults. Thank you, in advance, for your understanding.

Photo Identification Required

Effective immediately we will be requiring photo identification for ALL adults entering the building for special events, volunteering, lunch with your child, and for early dismissals. Several different people cover the front desk so everyone might not be familiar with the adults who are entering the building. In an effort to be consistent with all of our parents, we will require photo identification... even if you regularly come to the school. PLEASE remember to bring your photo identification with you EVERY time you enter the building. Again, this policy is not intended to inconvenience you but to provide the safest environment for our students.
