RENEWAL OF HARDSHIP AT CURRENT SCHOOL

If your child has previously attended a school (including attending KES) outside of your attendance zone on a previously approved hardship, please complete the "Renewal of Hardship Out of Zone Transfer at Current School" application to maintain attendance at the existing school.

FIRST-TIME HARDSHIPS

A student may be granted a "Hardship Transfer" when a condition or situation exists that implies an adverse or compelling circumstance or a state of misfortune unique to that student's life or a family's life situation. The situation could impact the student's ability to achieve success at their zoned school.

Not being selected by the lottery for Controlled Open Enrollment does not constitute a hardship.

GRANDFATHERED REQUESTS

Fifth, Eighth and Twelfth grade students may request to remain at his or her previous school. The parent must submit a Hardship Out of Zone Application for consideration. Younger siblings, however, must attend their zoned school.
