
Passport to Learning

Page 1/Cover: Make sure your child's first and last name with teacher & grade is on the front cover.

Page 3 – "Virtual Learning". We highly encourage students to begin over Winter Break. However, they have until March 14th. Students will need to login to the appropriate website. See below:

Page 4 – "Charter Counts". This must be completed at school between January 7th – March 14th.

Page 5 – "Independent Reading". Students must complete this between January 7th – March 14th. HOWEVER, we encourage students to get a "jump-start" on their reading over Winter Break. Students can then take AR tests as soon as they return.

Page 6 – "Homework". This is a teacher monitored between January 7th – March 14th. The goal is 100% homework. Grade-levels will have specifics on any bonus or make-up.

Page 7 – "Attendance". This is a visual for students to monitor their attendance. We are striving for 90% attendance. No more than to 4 absences, tardies or early dismissals.
