Students in grade 3, 4, and 5 will soon be taking the FSA. This year all Florida State assessments will be paper-based. This should take a portion of the stress off the students. Those anxious testing jitters are enough without having to learn how to use computer tools and navigating the testing portal! So, what about those testing jitters? Anxiety or worry is that constant feeling or thought that prevents you from doing things and things you enjoy. Clothing/Dress Code
