Dear KES Families and Friends -

Thank you for a wonderful start to the school year. I am extremely pleased with the smooth start. The students have been wonderful, and the staff has been exceptional. The parental and community support have made us all feel very grateful. The tokens of appreciation of public education have been overwhelming – from treats and notes, to hugs and high-fives. THANK YOU! I feel very lucky and blessed. As many of you are aware, there have been some changes to public education. We have adopted new state standards called the B.E.S.T. Last year, we implemented the English and Language Arts B.E.S.T standards. This year, we have added the new math B.E.S.T Standards and we have begun using a new state testing tool – FAST, which stands for Florida Assessment of Student Thinking. The first of three FAST testing was administered during the month of September with a few make-ups that still need to be completed. There will be a total of three administered during the year; Progress Monitoring/PM 1, Progress Monitoring/PM 2, and PM3, which is the summative. By now, parent reports on your child's EAST testing have been earth home. They are also be accessed on child's FAST testing have been sent home. They can also be accessed on Home Access Center (HAC). If your child scored a level 1 on the FAST, do not panic, but make sure you attend your Parent/Teacher In-Take Conference (Oct. 10 - Oct. 21). The test assesses students on end of the year expectations. It is expected that students would not be scoring very high on the assessment as we are teaching the standards during the school year. However, it helps the teacher, and the parent, pinpoint areas to focus on.

On a side note, there are several mandated letters, our school is trying to be very deliberate in timing so that we do not confuse parents. Please be patient as we are working within required timelines. However, always reach out to your child's teacher if you have a concern or question.



### **COVID** Information

There is no longer a dedicated district COVID hotline. For all future COVID-related testing, questions, or concerns, please consult your child's pediatrician for guidance and recommendations. Should the pediatrician recommend your child stay home from school, please notify your child's teacher(s) of their upcoming absence. Upon return to school, a parent or doctor's note must be provided to excuse the absence. St. Johns County School District will no longer provide exposure notifications.



Gentle Reminder: The wooden gate on Cordova/Visitor Center will be used for all drop offs and pickups. The Orange Street gate will always remain locked. In addition, on Friday evenings, ALL GATES will be locked for the entire weekend. Any cars in the lot after 6:00 p.m. will be locked in.

## **KES Café**

Free and reduced eligibility for meals from the past school year has expired, so that if an application for this school year has not been submitted, all meals are full price \$1.25 for breakfast and \$2.80 for lunch. Please monitor your child's meal account through paypams.com and keep the account paid in full.

## Housekeeping

#### Check-out Policy

If you need to check your student out early, please know that we do not permit early checkout after 2:15pm on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday and after 1:15pm on Wednesday. We are preparing to dismiss our students, and teachers are finishing academic instruction for the day. Thank you for understanding!

Dismissal Changes Parents/guardians, please be sure to note student's dismissal changes in your student's planner. This helps us to ensure a safe dismissal and avoid classroom interruption. In the event of an emergency dismissal change, please call before 1:15pm (Wed)/2:15pm

**Car Tags** Car tags must be displayed on your rearview mirror when picking up your child in Parent Pick-Up. This helps the staff to identify you as someone who is allowed to pick up your student and gives staff the opportunity to radio ahead so that your child is ready at the curb for pick-up. Additional car tags may be purchased at the front office for \$2 (cash only). In addition, please make sure you display your car tag when

In addition, please make sure you display your car tag when parked in our school parking lot to avoid being towed. <u>School Access</u> To enter any St. John County school, you MUST have an approved School Access Form on file and scan your Driver's License at the front office. The application link is located on our KES website under School Access. This process can take up to 4-6 weeks.
