A team representing Ketterlinus Elementary School achieved Highest Honors in the recent WordMasters Challenge[™]—a national vocabulary competition involving nearly 125,000 students annually. The fifthgrade team scored an impressive 197 points out of a possible 200 in the second of three meets this year, placing first in the nation! Way to go Ketterlinus!

Competing in the difficult Blue Division of the WordMasters Challenge[™], fifth graders Sean Carcaba, Wyatt Eubanks, Lourdes Gallego, Om Hallinan, James Hartley, Lucia Huerbsch, June Brown, and Daniel Wooldridge each earned a perfect score of 20 on the challenge.
