Dear KES Families, and Friends

Thank you for a great start of the year. It has been a little challenging with some changes in policies and procedures. I want to do a "repeat" of a previous principal's article I have sent out over the two years regarding cell phones and/or wireless communication devices. This summer, the state passed a law regarding wireless devices in schools. Please ensure that your child is keeping their devices turned off and away in their back packs - if they must bring them to school.

From Principal's Corner of January of 2021.

I really cannot explain in words how this past year has been. The ups and downs of this year have been challenging for us, particularly our children. Although children have great resiliency, I can share with you that I have never seen such an impact on the social and emotional well-being of children as I have over my 27 years in education. As a result of being more isolated and dependent on technology, many of our students are given smart phones. As a parent, I totally get the need of a phone for emergencies. My own children received cell phones to ensure they got home safely. So, what is different now?

My children did not have smart phones. No apps or social media platforms on the phone. A good old flip phone they could call or text on. I am not even sure they could take a photo or video. Maybe? But uploading it instantly had to be difficult.

Today, we are finding that smartphones with apps such as Snapchat or other social media platforms are where students are socializing. Elementary-aged students do not have the skills to understand how to engage appropriately online. Also, as busy adults we forget to filter what our children are seeing online. Children innately want to please and seek affirmation from others. They are easily influenced and will seek approval/affirmation. Think about it ... how many "likes" or comments on social media are now ways of affirmation they seek - from their online "friends."

So, I am asking for your support and help. If your child has a phone (or wireless device) and brings it to school, we will require that it be turned off - not just on silent, but the power turned off. In addition, I ask that you check your child's phone frequently, at least every few days. You should look for things that are being sent out and that they are receiving. Also, check the history on the phone's browser. Children are impressionable, so see what music and videos they are viewing.

Thank you for your support. I feel very honored of the trust you have in Ketterlinus to ensure your child is safe at school.

Classroom Libraries

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New Florida Law and State Board of Education Rule states that starting July 1, 2023, all books available to students must be reviewed by a certified media specialist. As a result, SJCSD staff is investing time and resources to support the robust classroom libraries that our teachers have built. Our first step in the process is to sort the classroom libraries into two groups - those that are listed in Destiny and those that are not. Destiny is the program we use to inventory and track circulation of library materials. Titles listed in Destiny have already been reviewed and approved by a certified media specialist. Therefore, the books in Destiny will remain in the classroom. Books that are not in Destiny must be stored until they are approved. Approving titles for a school collection is a process guided by SJCSD School Board Rule 4.131 School Library Media Services linked here: <u>https://www.stjohns.k12.fl.us/board/wp-content/uploads/</u> sites/11/2022/09/4-131.pdf. The effort to add titles will be ongoing.

We believe that access to books by elementary students is critical to growing into successful and informed readers. Our elementary students have time in the media center on a regular basis to select books for checkout. Please ask them about their library books and read together often.

Check-out Policy

If you need to check your student out early, please know that we do not permit early checkout after 2:15pm on Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays and after 1:15pm on Wednesdays. We are preparing to dismiss our students, and teachers are finishing academic instruction for the day. Thank you for understanding!

Dismissal Changes

Parents/guardians, please be sure to note student's dismissal changes in your student's planner. This helps us to ensure a safe dismissal and avoid classroom interruption. In the event of an emergency dismissal change, please call before 1:15pm (Wed)/2:15pm (M, Tu, Th & Fr).

<u>Car Tags</u>

Car tags must be displayed on your rearview mirror when picking up your child in Parent Pick-Up. This helps the staff to identify you as someone who is allowed to pick up your student and gives staff the opportunity to radio ahead so that your child is ready at the curb for pick-up. Additional car tags may be purchased at the front office for \$2 (cash only). In addition, please make sure you display your car tag when parked in our school parking lot to avoid being towed.

Safety Reminders

- Drop off begins at 7:55am. Safety is our top priority at KES. Please do not allow your child to wait on the school property unsupervised.
- Please use the crosswalk when walking your child to school.
- All school zones and crossings are Hands Free Zones. Please finish your phone calls or texts before entering the parking lot and crossing zone if you do not have hands-free capabilities.

Please be sure to utilize this for reviewing your child's report cards and monitoring their progress throughout the year.

Tardiness

School opens at 7:55am. Students are tardy if not in their classroom by 8:25am. If a student arrives after 8:25am their parent/guardian must walk up to the front office to sign them in. **Please label all your child's belongings such as water bottles, lunchboxes, backpacks, etc.**
