Enrollment 24-25 School Year

Don't go down this slide! By Sue Brush, Instructional Literacy Coach

The "Summer Slide" in reading is the tendency for students to lose the reading gains made during the school year. Why? Students who do not read over the summer break from school not only slow their reading growth, but research also shows these students regress in their abilities. Students who read over the summer break continue to grow in their reading skills! Help prevent your child from going down that "Summer Slide in Reading" by continuing the daily reading routines you created during the school year.

Tips for Summer Reading

1. Read together with your child every day.

Make it fun by reading outside, on the front porch, patio, at the beach, or park. Take turns listening to your child read and reading to your child. Ask questions. Talk about what you are reading. For younger children, point out the relationship between words and sounds.

2. Set a good example!

Parents must be willing to model the behavior we want to see in our children. Keep a variety of reading material around the house. Turn off all electronic devices and have each person read his or her book, including mom and dad.

3. Read the same book your child is reading and discuss it.

This is the way to develop habits of interacting with the text and build the capacity for thought and insight.

 $\bf 4.$ Let kids choose what they want to read and encourage reading in all genres.

It will open their minds to new reading experiences and motivate kids to want to read.

5. Listen to audio books.

Listen to them in the car or turn off the TV and have the family listen to them together.

6. Take your child to the library regularly.

Weekly visits to the St. Johns County Public Library provide fun reading opportunities.

Remember, at Ketterlinus Elementary School we believe, Readers are Leaders!
