- Works well in group activities/fairness

Academic Expectations

In third grade many new skills and concepts are introduced, such as multiplication and division, cursive writing, and lengthy writing compositions. Previously introduced concepts are further developed that require a strong foundation of primary skills. In addition, students also transition to reading chapter books if they have not already done so. FAST State testing for reading and math is given on a different platform starting in third grade.
